Information assurance provides security tips

The Air Force Network Integration Center is conducting an Information Assurance Assessment and Assistance Program inspection here April 16 - 24.

The purpose of this inspection is to ensure computer, emission, and communication security programs meet Air Force security standards, said Master Sgt. James Howell, 52nd Communications Squadron wing information assurance officer.

Inspectors will visit various work centers throughout the base to gauge Airmen's security awareness during the IAAP.

Howell said AFNIC inspects to make sure Air Force network users know the following do's and dont's of information security:

•Don't leave common access cards in keyboards or leave logged-on computers unattended as doing so may jeopardize national security by potentially giving full, unguarded access to a wealth of information.

•Don't connect rogue devices like flash drives, memory sticks, thumb drives and camera- memory cards to network computers.

IA approved external hard-drives can be plugged in as long as they are labeled "Unclassified" by IA.

•Don't play privately owned media CDs, DVDs or MP3s in network computers as they may contain software or internet downloads.
