Sabers must stop illegal dumping of refuse

There is an increasing trend of Sabers illegally dumping refuse on base.

Illegal dumping is classified as a member residing off base dumping their household waste and debris in on-base receptacles.

Household waste must be disposed of by residents in accordance with their community's local policies and regulations. Limited exceptions exist for short notice moves of two weeks or less not aligning with the local community trash pick-up schedule.

Proper sorting and recycling of waste is German law and required of U.S. Air Forces in Europe sponsored military and civilian members. This applies to all members, whether they live off base or on base. All members are authorized and encouraged to use the base recycling center for disposal of all recyclables.

- The recycling center accepts:
- bulk trash, such as mattresses

- glass
- wood
- plastic foam
- green waste, such as compost
- used cooking oil
- electronics
- scrap metal
- cardboard or paper
- plastic
- light bulbs
- batteries

- household chemicals, such as kitchen and bathroom cleaning supplies

- paint
- used clothing

- Automotive items should be taken to the auto hobby shop.

The recycling center's hours are Monday, Tuesday and Friday from 11 a.m. - 5 p.m.; closed Wednesday; Thursday from 9 a.m. - 6 p.m...

This was the moment of truth for two Airmen from Spangdahlem who had been hard at work training for their first mixed martial arts competition.

These Spangdahlem MMA team fighters worked out three times a day before their fights. When fighters here prepare for cage fight matches, it is mandatory they attend MMA team practices at least three days a week to condition their bodies and teach one another fighting techniques.

The fighters are built into well-rounded

punching, kicking and wrestling machines in the cage because each fighter brings different skill sets to the table.

Cologne offers things for everyone to enjoy

Cologne, located on the Rhine river, is the third-largest German city and industry.

The city is a popular travel destination for people from near and far, whether it is during the holiday season with the Weihnachtsmarkt, or Christmas markets, opening mid-November, or in the springtime, when Fashing attracts tens of thousands of visitors to celebrate the arrival of spring.

It also boasts multiple cultural events and many shopping opportunities..

Towering above the city are the steeples of the world-famous Koelner Dom, or Cologne Cathedral. This church is one example of High Gothic style architecture, and one of the few large buildings in the world that has been executed in such a uniform way.

It took 632 years to complete the Cologne Cathedral, and by that time the monument was the focal point of the city, towering above the famous Rhine-side view. Among the

treasures in the Dom are the Gero cross, dating back to 975 A.D.; the Occident's oldest large sculpture; the Shrine of the Three Magi; an example of goldsmith's work from the Rhine area; and the large-winged altar painting, called the Dombild. Stephan Lochner created the Dombild around 1450, and it is considered a masterpiece of the Cologne Art

School. The choir fittings have been

preserved entirely, and so have the statues of the 12 apostles in the choir. Anyone entering the cathedral may be overwhelmed when looking up at the tall windows and the steep vaulting.

COLOGNE, Germany -- Cologne is the largest city in North Rhine Westphalia and the fourth largest city in Germany. Cologne is only slightly smaller than Berlin or Hamburg. It is made up of nine urban districts and a total of 85 quarters, known as "Veedel" in Cologne dialect. Cologne has seven Rhine bridges and 10 motorways, which make up an excellent transport system. Each day more than 1,000 trains enter or leave Cologne Hauptbahnhof, or main station. Over the last few years, the international Cologne-Bonn Airport has become the German hub for budget airlines and air freight, whereas the harbor has made it the second largest inland port location in Germany. The most famous beverage of Cologne is Koelsch beer. (Courtesy photo)

of Roman times, Hohe Strasse, is Cologne's most famous street for shopping. The most prominent evidence of the Roman times are the remains of the city walls, the Roemerturm, and the 14-meter high Poblicius Tomb in The Roemisch-Germanisches Museum, which dates back to the time around 40 A.D. This museum presents the Roman everyday life and shows wonders of art such as glass, ceramics and much more.
