Climate assessment survey ends soon

B ase employees can still complete the 52nd Fighter Wing Installation Climate Assessment survey until May 3.

The anonymous survey, a part of the U.S. Air Force's Equal Opportunity Climate Assessment Program, is an opportunity for submitters to provide quality-of-life feedback directly to wing, group and squadron leadership.

"Participation in the survey is important, because it identifies issues or problems that the leaders at the top may not know about," said U.S. Air Force Tech. Sgt. Jasmine Barnes, 52nd FW Equal Opportunity specialist from Houston. "The results from the survey show an overall snapshot of the health of the organization - the good, the bad, what we need to continue doing, what we need to cut."

The questions on the survey are designed to identify trends, either positive or negative. There are 40 questions standard to all assessment surveys and additional questions specific to Spangdahlem.

Positive feedback encourages growth, and any

negative feedback provides leadership with target areas of improvement.

The results of the survey will be compiled and reported to Col. David Julazadeh, 52nd FW commander, in mid May.

While anonymous, the survey will record demographic data, participation percentages and user comments to allow Julazadeh to draw conclusion of his base's view on camaraderie, readiness and morale.

Some data is also forwarded to higher Air Force agencies for Spangdahlem's input to shape the future of the service.

"Don't be fearful of taking the assessment," Barnes said. "This is your opportunity to make things better. Some people think their individual voices aren't heard -- well, this is your chance."

To take the survey, visit http://www.famnetuca. net/user/login/login02.cfm. The site is not CACenabled, meaning the participant can take the survey from home. However, each squadron has been assigned a unique access code.

irmen from Spangdahlem Air Base's 480th Fighter Squadron deployed to Kandahar Airfield, Afghanistan, in support of contingency operations April 7, 2013.

The 480th FS is deploying for approximately six months to provide air-to-air combat and air-tosurface attack capabilities.

"I'm looking forward to leading the squadron down-rage, supporting the guys who are on the ground and doing the job that we're tasked to do

... I think everybody is really looking forward to do the job we've been training so hard for," said Austin native Lt. Col. Cameron Caroom, 480th FS commander.

The 480th has prepared for more than four months for this deployment through multiple exercises with the most recent being Red Flag 2013, an aerial combat training exercise held in Las Vegas.

"It's game time," Caroom said. "Everything up to this point has been practiced and rehearsed. We've got six months of game to play and we're ready to go."

In addition to participating in exercises, the

squadron also catered their home-base training to prepare for Afghanistan's environment.

The 480th communicated with the fighter squadron they replaced in Afghanistan to prepare and plan for what was ahead. They went over such things as successful tactics, techniques and procedures best used to accomplish the mission.

On this deployment, 480th maintainers, pilots and support crews will work around the clock to ensure combat air power is provided over head for service members on the ground.

"That's what the mission is and what everyone is looking forward to doing," Caroom said.
