AF discusses sexual assault prevention

Airmen with the 52nd Fighter Wing paused their daily operations June 25 to discuss the negative impact of sexual assault in today's Air Force.

The Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Stand Down Day was a mandated day of reflection for wing commanders to educate their Airmen on how to prevent what is becoming the service's top challenge.

"I need you to put on your thinking caps and be serious in your small group sessions to brainstorm solutions," said Col. David Julazadeh, 52nd FW commander. "This is about trying to come up with ways to combat the problem. Ultimately, it's a culture change — we need to make the Air Force a place to be proud of."

The Stand Down Day included large-group forums, smaller breakout sessions and direct involvement with experts from the legal office and the Area Defense Council. The focus of the discussions included the duty and obligation Airmen have to uphold the Air Force core values of integrity, service and excellence.

However, these ideals are generally accepted in every branch of the Department of Defense as a higher standard of conduct for service members.

The Saber community recently came together in the interest of improving conditions for the Youth Programs Instructional Gymnastics program practice facility.

The 52nd Civil Engineer Squadron in conjunction with the Defense Commissary Agency Europe and the Exchange Service renovated an old warehouse into a new gymnastics facility at Bitburg Annex.

In addition to relocating equipment to a larger facility, nearly 60 Saber volunteers helped with the installing and securing of equipment as well.

"The entire community will benefit from it, because more classes can be held at the same time," said Lt. Col Richard Cole, 52nd Mission Support Group deputy commander. "Now, we can overlap classes and meet the needs of the families in a timelier manner.

"Also, a bigger facility means a safer environment for the students and therefore the progression of each gymnast," he added. "This move will positively affect Saber families for years to come."

The upgrades were made possible by the ingenuity of the 52nd CES team working the project by incorporating supplies that were not in use but applicable to the renovation. This made the cost for the changes virtually next to nothing. It also created the ability to add additional features to the facility such as a parent viewing area and safer routes in and out of the building.
